We hope all is well. Presented below is our latest Durian Projects newsletter covering key news involving ourselves and durian.


Durian Projects this month is pleased to announce that it has introduced Aquilaria trees as a new intercrop on its plantation. These intercrop trees are planted between existing durian trees making efficient use of available land and creating additional profit for our project. Profit will be generated from selling the tree leaves which are used to create products such as herbal teas which are consumed across Asia and the Middle East for a range of medicinal benefits.

Other big news this month has been China's aggressive pursuit of durian fruit suppliers from across Asia. China has seen record -breaking imports of durian five years in a row now with imports last year up 82% in value to a record USD 4.2 billion (RM 18.5 billion). Although Musang King durian is the most expensive and in-demand variety within China lack of supply has forced them to seek fruits from elsewhere such as Vietnam and the Philippines. Last month saw the first-ever exports of durian from Vietnam to China, and China approving the importation of durian from the Philippines.

These market development are not a threat to Malaysian durian as our quality is far superior but does show how important durian is to China. The country with the support of its government has the ability and demand to purchase all our durian production for decades ahead which is good for Durian Projects and all of Malaysia. The faster we can increase our production capacity the better we can position Malaysia to benefit from one of our most valuable natural resources, Musang King.

Vietnam exports its first Durians to China amid fraud concerns

Vietnam last month exported its first-ever shipment of fresh durian fruit, totaling 100 mt. The momentous occasion, however, has been impacted with fraud allegations with reports indicating Vietnamese companies are falsifying import quality controls, records, and permits, to ship illegal fruit. Records show Vietnam has permits to export 1.3 million tons of durian fruit yet it can only produce 68,000 tons.

Until recently, Thailand was the only country authorized to export fresh durians to China. China has desperately been trying secure durian fruit from as many markets as possible recently due to growing domestic demand, and limited export supply.

JP Morgan sees Malaysian economy growing 7.70% this year

JP Morgan has reported that the Malaysian economy is to be one of the best performing in the region, with annual gross domestic product (GDP) growing 7.70% in 2022.
