Johor is the main producer of durian in Malaysia the government has announced. A record volume of 148,365 metric tons of durian was produced in 2023 growing 26% since 2020. Growing export demand has pushed substantial amounts of investment into durian. The Johor state government also announcing that this year, it will upgrade facilities and FAMA durian collection and processing centres.
