The headline news in this months edition includes the succesfull completion of Australia's Malaysian durian fest. Multiple durian fest events were held across Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide and Perth since May, organised by Durasia and the Department of Malaysian Agriculture. The events were held in an effort to promote our beloved Musang King and inspire a legion of durian fans across Australia. Australia has become one of the fastest growing markets for Malaysian durian and we are constantly seeing enquiries from buyers based there.

In other news, Malaysian durian prices continue rising due to higher operating costs mainly fertilizer costs resulting from the Ukraine war. Growing international demand has pushed prices even higher as new markets have begun importing such as South Korea, Japan, Australia and even African countries such as Kenya. Frozen durian prices are expected to rise 40% this year with fresh durian likely to double.

Malaysian frozen durians will cost 40% more this year

International durian lovers are in for a shock this year as frozen durian prices are to increase 40% due to low production, higher labour and fertiliser costs. Compounding the bad news, frozen durian exports will also drop by 50%, due to strong domestic demand and lower yields.

Musang King and Black Thorn durian prices are spiking

Musang King prices in Singapore have jumped to reach 25 SGD/KG from between 15-18 SGD/KG last year. This has been due to rising operating costs, limited production and increasing demand from China, Hong Kong and even Europe, all of which have limited available export supply.

World Bank sees Malaysian economy growing 5.50% this year

The World Bank on June 13th released its Malaysian economic growth forecast this year, expecting growth of 5.50%. Growth in private consumption is forecast to grow even further by 8.5% for its fastest pace since 2008. This is one of the fastest globally surpassing much of Asia, including China.
